The Mayor:

- thanked all those who attended the recent Mayoral Election and expressed his thanks to everyone for the good wishes extended to him for his year as Mayor.
- thanked the Elected Members for their attendance at the National Commemoration Day Regional Ceremony held in Kilkenny Castle and all those involved in the organising of same.
- Encouraged everyone to come out and support the Kilkenny Senior Hurling Team at the Civic Reception for the Homecoming in Nowlan Park.

- Acknowledged the success of holding the All Ireland Minor Hurling Final in Nowlan Park as this was the first time Kilkenny hosted such an event.
- Congratulated all involved in the organising of Kilkenny Arts Festival which was launched recently particularly Emer Foley and Olga Barry and asked people to support the events organised.
- Advised that the 100th Anniversary of Michael Collins will have passed before the next meeting of the Municipal District. The Mayor asked that a small event be held in honour of Michael Collins around the time of anniversary.

Following a discussion on the recent Special Meeting regarding the one way traffic system, it was:

3. Nuashonrú ar Bhóithre - Roads Update

(i) Northern Ring Road Extension (Presentation).

The Mayor welcomed Seamus Kavanagh, Senior Engineer and Dermot Donovan, Road Plan Consulting to the meeting. Mr. Tim Butler outlined the background to the Northern Ring Road Project and the steps taken to date advising that in October 2021 the Council went to tender and appointed Road Plan Consulting to carry out the first step in a seven step process in order to get the project back onto the National Development Plan being a Strategic Assessment Report. The SAR Report had to take into a consideration a number of changes that have taken place in the recent passed such as new spending code, climate action measures, smarter travel initiatives, Town Centre First and Healthy Ireland initiatives.

Dermot Donovan gave a presentation to the meeting on the Strategic Assessment Report under the following headings:

- Location and Layout of the previous Scheme.
- Bridge Elevation.
- Traffic Reduction in the City.
- Objectives and Benefits of the Scheme.
- Challenges.
- List of Potential Options.
- Public Spending Code.

Following the presentation, the Elected Members thanked Mr. Donovan for his presentation and raised issues and queries in relation to:

- Expected Cost Range.
- Timeline of the Project.
- Inform the public of the process.
- Acquisition of land included in Business Plan.
- Schools and Western Environs included in Business Plan.
- Timeline is too long for the completion of Ring Road.
- Result in extra traffic on the Freshford Road.
- This is welcome extension of the Ring Road not a completion.

- Measures included to prevent HGVs going through the City.
- Copy of presentation to be circulated.

In response to the queries/issues raised, Tim Butler and Dermot Donovan advised that while this is an extension of the Ring Road, it is not a linear process. Different sections can commence and run separately. The traffic increase on the Freshford Road will be quite marginal.

Seamus Kavanagh, Senior Engineer informed the meeting that the Council are looking at options in relation to making an application for 100% funding in relation to the connection to the Callan Road. This project is not a national objective at the moment and the purpose of the SAR Report is to get the project on National list so that it will be provided with funding.

Mayor, Cllr. David Fitzgerald asked what are the next steps to be taken in order to move the project forward.

Tim Butler responded by saying that the SAR document will be submitted to the Department and once approved it will allow for the appointment of Consultants to bring the project to the preliminary business case stage.

Dermot Donovan outlined to the meeting the steps for the rest of the process.

Tim Butler stated that the presentation will be given to the full Council at the next meeting to get approval to submit SAR document to the Department.
